Lent Countdown Chain Instructions

I love getting The Little Black Book at Church around the beginning of Lent and going through the readings and reflections each day. This year I was wondering how can I make this work for my kids too? At a minimum, I'd love for us to read the scripture together. For kids, they get exposed to more scripture, for adults use the scripture to meditate on and pray. I put each day's scripture on a printable that you cut into strips and use to make a countdown chain for Lent. The scripture in the Little Black Book goes through the passion of Christ as told in Luke, a few verses at a time. As you pull off one chain length everyday, you'll slowly read through the whole story.

If you have small children, and you think the passion is a little too heavy for them, I've made a second set of printable chain lengths with a Lenten task for them to complete each day. They are small ways to pray, sacrifice, or do something for someone else (sounds familiar, sort of like praying, fasting and almsgiving right?). In that set, you'll find "Pray for your mom," "Pray a decade of the Rosary," "Do an extra chore today," and "Help clean the dishes and the kitchen." These can be chained in any order, and are perfect for children.

I made my chain in the shape of hearts, to go with a scripture quote "Make your hearts firm." James 5:8 I also made a little header picture with that verse to use at the top of your chain, or however you wish.

Instructions are pretty simple:

I printed these on some purple scrapbooking paper, but you could also print on purple construction paper, or plain white paper.

Cut along the black lines.

If you are using the scripture chain pieces, you will want to keep them in order (I numbered them). Number 40 goes at the bottom and 1 at the top. (That way you count down from 40) If you are using the Lenten tasks for children, then the order really doesn't matter.



For making a regular chain with them, just bend your slip of paper in a loop and staple together. Take the next slip and make a loop that goes through your first and staple. Keep going!





To make a heart shaped chain, fold your first slip in half (slip #1 for the scripture chain lengths).



Then take the ends and bend them in towards one another and secure with a staple.




To add a link, fold your next slip of paper in half, and bend the ends in toward each other with the tip of the first heart inside the two ends. Staple.



Keep going!



Hang up your chain around a doorway, lay it out around your table centerpiece, or drape it over your dining room table. Each day pull off one chain length and read it!

But they were adamant and said, "He is inciting the people with his teaching throughout all Judea, from Galilee where he began even to here." On hearing this Pilate asked if the man was a Galilean; and upon learning that he was under Herod's jurisdiction, he sent Jesus to Herod who was in Jerusalem at that time. Lk 233-7

Herod was very glad to see Jesus; he had been wanting to see him for a long, for he had heard about him and had been hoping to see him perform some sign. Lk 23:8



Instructions for the Temptation in the Desert Minibook

Why is Lent 40 days? Well you probably already know, but Jesus went into the wilderness/desert for 40 days and 40 nights to be tempted by the devil. Today I'm sharing a simple minibook with you with some writing prompts for your kids to think about.

If your kids have never heard why Lent is 40 days, they can learn from this minibook. It then asks you to **think about the ways you are tempted, where you are when you're tempted, and how to overcome temptation**. Your kids can draw pictures, write about it, or just reflect on these questions to further their relationship with Our Father.

I think it's good practice to know your own limitations, and it's not something we often sit and reflect on. I know it's deep for a minibook, but adapt it for whatever age groups you have. For example, I had to explain what temptation is to my 4 year old. I gave her my best 4 year old appropriate definition: being tempted is when you feel like doing something you know is wrong. We discussed it for a few minutes, and she decided she is tempted when there is candy in the pantry and she can reach it but knows she's supposed to ask first. She also decided she is tempted to jump on the couch all the time. lol 4 year olds are so honest. (btw that candy is now on a higher shelf!)

Some of the ways you might be tempted could include: candy on a low shelf, being home alone, hanging around the wrong kind of friends, having sweets in the house at all, etc... answers will be different for all age groups.

Some places you might be tempted: at home, at school, on the playground, an all you can eat buffet;)

Ways to overcome temptation (make sure you focus on these!): attending mass, praying, fasting, reading the Bible, singing Christian songs, going to youth group... etc

The prayer to Saint Michael is on the back. When you're done discussing or writing or drawing, pray it together!

How to Fold your minbook

(use these same instructions for all minibooks in this pack)

Print your Mini Book (one sided on white paper). *These pictures show a different minibook but the procedure is the same.*

Fold paper in half the long skinny way, with the print on the outside. Crease well.

Unfold, and refold in half the short, fat, way with the print on the outside. Crease well.

Unfold, and fold the outside edges inward

(like a pamphlet or lapbook). Crease well.








Unfold, and refold in half the short, fat way again. Using scissors, cut along the crease in the middle, stopping when you meet the intersection of creases (see the picture below).

Open up at the cut, and fold around into a book with the cover in front.






Purple—our Lenten Liturgical Color

Originally, purple was a color of royalty– back in the days of Rome being a major power. Emperors, kings and queens are often shown in a purple – probably because the dye to produce purple was the most expensive and rare at the time. In the Catholic Church, violet or purple symbolizes penance, preparation, and sacrifice. We use it during Advent and Lent, and it is sometimes used for a funeral Mass. The next time you are in Mass this Lent, see how many places you see the color purple displayed!

Overlap the side flaps and secure with tape, glue stick, or glue dots.

























Almsgiving Box Instructions

This cute printable Almsgiving Box isn't labeled with any specific organization, so you can donate to the charity of your choice. Write your own charity in the white space at the top. If you are teaching little ones about giving, have each choose a different charity to donate to, and make it a little competition... who can collect the most money for their charity?

The printable has the box both in **black and white or color** so you can choose how much ink to use on this project!


Assembly is pretty straightforward. **Print** on cardstock. **Cut out.** For the little holes on the top sides (where the handle tabs insert), I just used a **hole puncher and punched holes over the oval**. To go the extra mile, use your scissors or an exacto knife to carefully cut out the oval.

Fold and secure the bottom tabs and the side tab using glue stick, tape or glue dots. I recommend tape for the bottom of this one for strength, especially if you think you'll be collecting a lot of coins.

Slide the tabs into the oval-ish holes and ta-da, you have a little Almsgiving box with handles for easy carrying to wherever you plan to donate. The top even has a little open slit perfect for your coins to slide into.

I put a few quotes on the back, so you can use it as a teaching aid too! One from the Catechism "Giving alms to the poor is a witness to fraternal charity; it is also a work of justice pleasing to God." CCC 2462 and from Matthew 25:45" As you did it not to one of the least of these, you did it not to me."






Dice of Sacrifice Instructions

Is it the night before Ash Wednesday and you still haven't thought of what to give up for Lent? Maybe you can't think of anything to give up, or maybe you have so many ideas you can't decide on just one. Too bad there isn't a magic 8 ball for lenten sacrifice... but there is the

THE DICE OF SACRIFICE

(imagine in a big deep voice)

I made several because I just couldn't decide which way to go with this. One of them is filled in for your kids with sides listing: candy, cartoons, video games, soda, cookies and a blank space. One is for you moms (or me). The sides say Facebook, Pintrest, Comparing myself to others, Sugar, Negativity and Yelling at my kids (I don't know about you but I think it's hard to be stern in a quiet voice- I'm working on it). Maybe none of those are even what you're considering, so I made a blank one for you to write your own ideas.

Instructions are pretty simple. **Print.** (Cardstock recommended, but not required). **Cut out**. **Fold** the tabs and sides at 90 degree angles, and **secure with tape or glue dots**. The tabs tuck in for gluing or glue dotting, or you can just run tape along the outside seams of the cube, whatever is easier for you. Personally, I think <u>glue dots</u> are a sign that God wants us to craft with our kids. They're so easy for kids to use, I love them.










- You can roll it once, on Ash Wednesday, to decide what to give up for all of Lent.
- If you've already decided on what to give up, take your Lenten fasting one step further and give up one extra thing everyday. Roll the dice first thing in the morning and add that thing to your sacrifices for the day.

Technically only 14 year olds and older are required to fast during Lent, so you could use the kids version for your **youngsters to practice lenten sacrifice**. For someone little, 40 days is awfully long, and giving up something for just one day at a time could be good practice.



Fold the sides in such that the top corner is right where the top flap folds down, and the bottom edge lines up with the bottom of the money bag.

Secure with tape or glue dots.

Squeeze the sides together to give it more shape, and see all the silver Judas traded for turning in Jesus.




Instructions for the Chalice/Wine and Bread:



First print the printable on cardstock. Color it in and cut out the pieces.



Fold the tabs in on the Chalice pieces



Secure the smaller curved piece (the bottom of the chalice) to the bread piece using the dotted line rectangles for guidance. Use glue dots or tape (glue stick may not work.




Secure the larger curved piece (the top of the chalice) to the bread piece using the dotted line rectangles for guidance. First attach the bottom piece, then the sides.



It should look like this now.



Roll the rectangular piece (the chalice stem) so that the two flaps overlap. It should form a half circle from the side, the flat part is where the flaps overlap.




Secure the stem to the bread using the dotted line rectangle for guidance. Use tape or glue dots.

Instructions for Calvary Hill:



First print the printable on cardstock. Color it in and cut out the pieces.



Tuck the tabs under on the calvary hill piece and secure with tape or glue dots.




Gently bend the hill so you can snip the black line slits for the crosses to go in. You can also use an exacto knife if you feel your students/ children are old enough.



Slide the crosses into the slits. Secure to the underneath of the hill using tape or glue dots.



Instructions for the Tomb:



First print the printable on cardstock. Color it in and cut out the pieces.



Crease the tabs inward.



Fold into a cube and secure with tape, glue stick or glue dots. You can reinforce the outsides of the seams with tape if needed.

Instructions for assembling into a mobile:



First print the printable on cardstock. Color it in and cut out.



Attach the ends together overlapping them a little. Staple, tape, or glue dot together. Glue stick will probably not work.

Hole punch 7 times around the bottom. I hole punched at the bottom of each picture to go with each hangable item.

For Jesus and the donkey, secure Jesus to the donkey using glue dots or tape. Then loop your string through the top of Jesus' head. Tie to the hole you punched near the palm leaves.


Hole punch near the top of the remaining printables. Tie a string through them and secure around the mobile ring.

Punch four holes on the top side of the mobile to hang it from. Tie strings to each hole and tie together in a big knot where they meet. A completed picture is on the next page.




How you hang each piece, and how long the string is, is up to you. I made each piece a different length, cutting a longer one as we progressed through the week. You can hang them all at the same length or however you choose though.






Palm Sunday Jesus riding into Jerusalem on a donkey 3-D Printable





Tuesday of Holy Week Jesus curses a fig tree on his way to Jerusalem 3-D Printable



















Palm Sunday Jesus riding into Jerusalem on a donkey 3-D Printable





